

**FAIR OAKS WATER DISTRICT
SELF-CERTIFIED WATER CONSERVATION STANDARD**

On May 9, 2016, the Governor issued an Executive Order that directs the state board to adjust and extend its emergency water conservation regulations through the end of January 2017 in recognition of the differing water supply conditions for many communities.

The drought conditions that formed the basis of the Governors emergency proclamations continue to exist. The drought conditions will likely continue for the foreseeable future and additional action by both the State Water Resources Control Board and local water suppliers will likely be necessary to prevent waste and unreasonable use of water and to promote conservation.

Self-Certification Requirement:

To prevent the waste and unreasonable use of water and to meet the requirements of the Governor’s May 9, 2016 Executive Order, each urban water supplier is required to submit a self-certification of supply reliability for three additional years of drought.

Each urban water supplier is required to identify and report no later than June 22, 2016, on a form provided by the Board, the conservation standard that the supplier will be required to meet in accordance with the May 9, 2016 executive order.

Based on the information and assumptions identified in the May 9, 2016 executive order, the Fair Oaks Water District certified on June 22, 2016 a conservation standard of 0% reduction requirement.

Beginning June 1, 2016, each urban supplier is required to comply with the conservation standard it identifies and reports. Compliance with the conservation standard reported shall be measured monthly and assessed on a cumulative basis through January 2017.

Fair Oaks Water District:

- Self-Certified Water Conservation Standard: 0%
- With a Higher Conservation Standard: Voluntary 20% Reduction

Supporting Analysis and Calculations:

Fair Oaks Water District has supplied data in accordance with wholesale water supplier (San Juan Water District) submitted information and with recently completed and submitted 2015 FOWD Urban Water Management Plan. The total available water supply projected for Fair Oaks Water District in 2017, 2018 and 2019 is 24% of the total supply reported by San Juan Water District for 2017, 2018 and 2019 with ground water available to the District that has not been reported.
